The Center for Biotechnology (CFB), located on the campus of Stony Brook University, is seeking experienced BioEntrepreneurs-in-Residence (BEIR) to launch new bioscience ventures in the Long Island, New York region. Company formation will be based upon commercially promising biomedical technologies emerging from the Stony Brook University (SBU) campus and other sources.

To help facilitate this process the CFB will provide:

- modest retainer/milestone payments to BEIR for a predetermined period of time
- modest budget for technology development
- senior staff support to assist with commercialization strategies
- office space
- access to experienced industry advisors
- introductions to investors and professional services

BEIRs will also have access to the resources of Stony Brook University including faculty expertise,

core research and engineering facilities, libraries, business incubators, the 245 acre Research Park, and a suite of end-to-end economic development programs. Newly formed companies locating on the Stony Brook University campus may also qualify for benefits under StartUP NY, a transformative program that will create tax-free zones on select State University of New York campuses.

BEIR(s) will be responsible for evaluation and selection of biomedical technologies that will ultimately form the basis of a company to be located in the Long Island region. The B-EIR will negotiate and execute option and/or license agreements with the Office of Technology Licensing and Industry Relations (OTLIR) as may be appropriate, secure capital from both public and private sources, and exit the B-EIR program to lead the Long Island-based company as CEO.

The most compelling B-EIR candidate(s) will

possess domain expertise and technical proficiency in the life sciences, as well as business acumen and industry experience, particularly in early-stage technology commercialization, new venture creation, and fundraising. Advanced degree in a life sciences field, business and/or law are preferred. Terms of engagement dependent upon percentage effort, experience, and the specific start-up opportunity selected. B-EIRs will report to the CFB and its Advisory Board (see below).
